Since 1983, the WindsorEssex Community Foundation (WECF) has been working to improve the quality of life for residents of Windsor and Essex County and to create and support opportunities for prosperity.

Originally dedicated to reclaiming Windsor's riverfront through projects like the Peace Fountain, our support extended to countless landmarks across Windsor and Essex County including the Ojibway Prairie Complex, the Ganatchio Trail extension and, the Great Canadian Flag Project. We are proud to continue our support of organizations throughout the community, increasing capacity through community partnerships.

The WindsorEssex Community Foundation is a perpetual community trust for philanthropic purposes. We assist donors in creating a lasting legacy to benefit and support their community, now and in the future. Through community investments, the WECF has invested over \$12 million in the community and has accumulated over \$23 million in assets.

Through programs like Vital Signs®, Inspiration 100^{TM} , Random Act of Kindness DayTM, and scholarship funds, the WECF is committed to inspiring philanthropy and community supporting community.

RANDOM ACT OF KINDNESS DAY™

Random Act of Kindness DayTM is a nation-wide celebration of kindness promoting a 'pay it forward' movement in the community that takes place annually. This past February, the WECF engaged in its own Random Act of Kindness through the VON and the Unemployed Help Centre by delivering over 250 cookies through the VON's Meals on Wheels Program and the South Essex Community Council's Meals on Wheels Program in the County. We also held a colouring contest for students across our local schoolboards, with the goal of making kindness the norm!

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS HELD AT THE WECF

The WECF holds scholarship funds that help students pursue a post-secondary education. This year, over \$25,000 in scholarships were awarded to local students pursuing a post-secondary education in various fields of study. The funding is available through scholarship funds that have been set up at the WECF by local families and individuals who wish to support local youth and have a positive impact on the future of youth in our community.


VITAL SIGNS®

100 PEOPLE, INFINITE POSSIBILITIES INSPIRATION 100TM

Inspiration 100™ is a group of 100 communityminded people who built an endowment fund within the WECF. Members meet annually to disburse grants to local charities. The Inspiration 100™ Association Members gathered via zoom for the Sixth Annual General Meeting and Fifth Annual Grant Awards Ceremony. A total of \$70,000 was granted to ten local charities. A nomination and voting process took place with the Inspiration 100™ Membership. Inspiration 100™ has welcomed 100 local community philanthropists into the Association and within the past five years alone, has granted \$215,000 to local charities within Windsor-Essex County. With the fund reaching \$1,000,000 within five years, the Association will continue to award grants to more local charities, ensuring long-term impact and support of Windsor-Essex County.

KIA COMMUNITIES IN MOTION

Kia Canada, in partnership with Community Foundations of Canada and community foundations across Canada launched Kia Communities in Motion. This all-new program is developed to support movement in local communities providing charities and the recipients of their efforts, the time, space and funding to find inspiration to move forward. Kia Canada will be investing \$1.4M over four years to fund projects in communities that will help build inclusive communities across the country.

Kia Communities in Motion is supporting moving grassroots efforts forward to create a future where everyone flourishes. The WECF provided grants to Women's Enterprise Skills Training of Windsor, Bike Windsor Essex and Black Boys Code to support projects that create a future where everyone flourishes.

CANADA HEALTHY COMMUNITIES INITIATIVE









As Canadians continue to adapt to the realities of COVID-19, local governments and community partners across the country are adapting their spaces and services to keep residents safe and healthy, support economic recovery, create jobs, and build vibrant, resilient communities.

Community Foundations in the Southwestern Ontario HUB worked together to provide \$744,000 in funding to support projects in Southwestern Ontario as part of the second round of the Canada Healthy Communities Initiative. Through the \$60-million Initiative, the Government of Canada, alongside Community Foundations of Canada, is building safer spaces and ensuring a higher quality of life for people across the country, by helping communities adapt to the challenges presented by COVID-19. There are over 1000 projects taking place across the country, including in every province and territory. 














SUPPORTING THE HEALTH & WELL-BEING OF OUR COMMUNITY

GREEN SHIELD CANADA **COMMUNITY IMPACT FUND**

In 2018, Green Shield Canada (GSC) launched a partnership program with Community Foundations by investing \$6 million to establish relationships with six Community Foundations across Canada. By the end of 2020, GSC had doubled to 12 Community Foundation partnerships and a total investment of \$10 million. Through these partnerships GSC can leverage the granting expertise, grassroots relationships, and community knowledge of local Community Foundations. The WindsorEssex Community Foundation is proud to be one of the 12 Community Foundation partners with GSC, and the local partner for investment.

In keeping with GSC's mission to invest in communities where they live and work, GSC is focusing their community investment initiatives on oral health and mental health. For oral health, GSC is supporting programs that help increase access to dental services for underinsured and uninsured Canadians. For mental health, GSC is investing in initiatives that support the delivery of mental health care and in advocacy projects that increase awareness of mental health issues and resources.

In September of 2021, \$450,000 was granted to six local charities to fund local programs that address the oral and mental health needs of the Windsor-Essex Community with a minimum target of positively impacting the lives of 3,000+ people through these granting projects. Established by agencies in order to benefit from the professional investment management and adminsitrative expertise that the Foundation has to offer.


WINDSORESSEX COMMUNITY FUND


