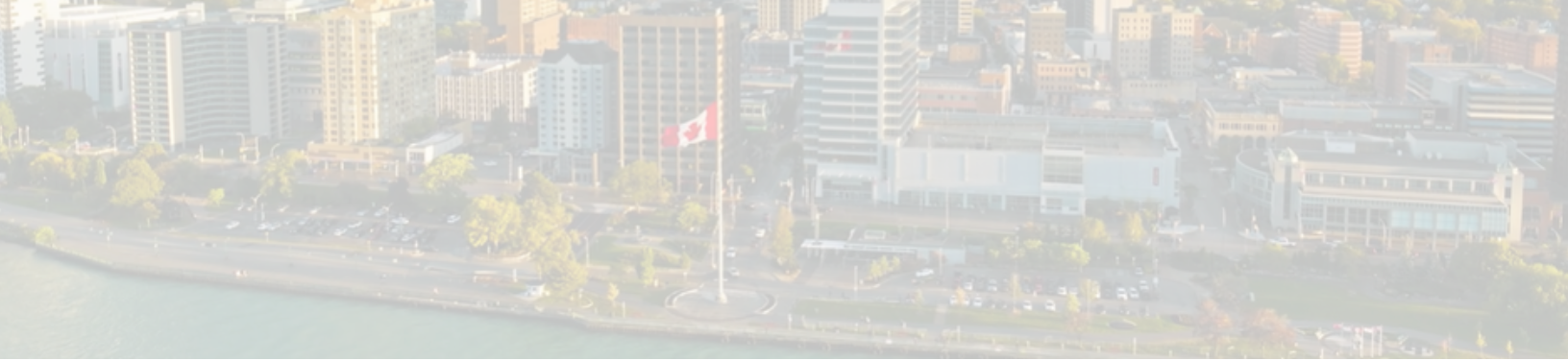

We are humbled by the overwhelming response from our charitable partners, who shared the meaningful and impactful work they are doing in our community. This year, we are proud to support seven organizations.

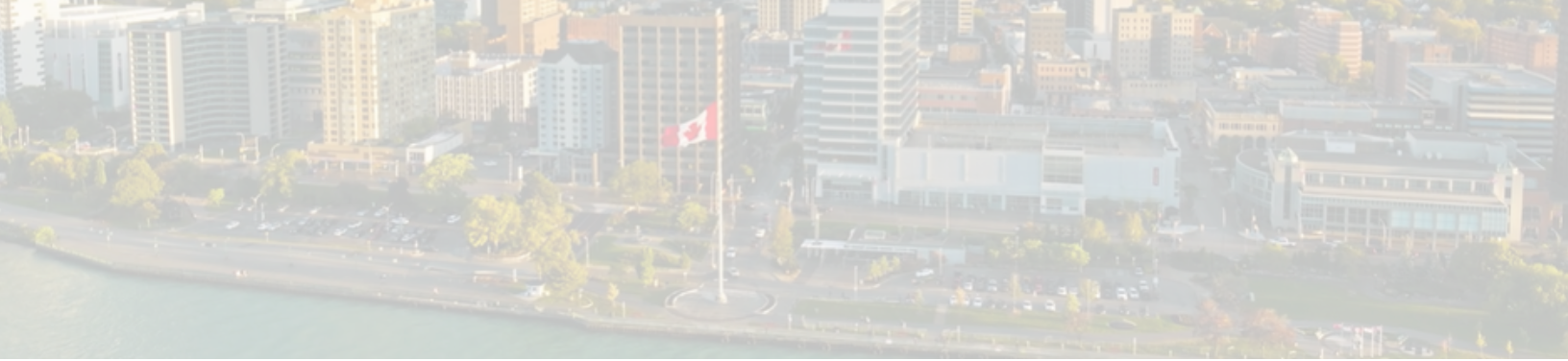

ART WINDSOR-ESSEX

Art Windsor-Essex (AWE) is seeking support for a year-long 2025–26 initiative offering monthly free admission days, designed to welcome thousands of visitors and expand access to the arts for people of all ages. As a public gallery committed to connecting communities with contemporary and historical art through exhibitions, education, and engagement, AWE will use this support to ensure the success of these high-attendance days by funding staffing and training, marketing and outreach across digital, print, and community channels, and materials for workshops and guided tours.

In partnership with Artcite Inc., this project will relocate the New Voices billboard to Ford City for one year, where it will host community-led programming that amplifies underrepresented and marginalized artists while uncovering local histories, highlighting the surrounding community, and fostering a strong sense of presence and belonging. Funding is being sought to support the billboard’s reinstallation and the delivery of eight exhibitions with accompanying community engagement activities, with additional support from the Arts Council Windsor & Region to strengthen local arts programming and community connections.

Your support will help create a more inclusive Windsor-Essex where individuals with sight loss can thrive, achieve their goals, and fully participate in every aspect of community life.

Donor support helps compensate local producers, strengthen frontline service organizations, and create meaningful volunteer opportunities for youth. Beyond meeting immediate needs, Good Greens contributes to a more sustainable and resilient local food system by reducing greenhouse gas emissions, supporting local agriculture, and fostering community collaboration. Spark is a weekly after-school program serving children in Grades 1–6 in the Margaret D. Bennie Public School community. Each week, 24 children gather in a forest setting to play, enjoy a healthy snack, and explore creative activities that build skills in art, reading, math, and everyday life. Spark provides enriching experiences for children while offering families reliable after-school support. Participants strengthen their social, learning, and life skills in a nurturing environment. Over time, meaningful relationships are formed among children, families, and volunteers. Junior Youth and high school volunteers develop leadership skills, earn service hours toward graduation, and gain valuable references for future employment. Families connect through four special events each year and receive referrals to additional services when needed.

We prepare youth for safe, skilled work through hands-on trade training, now expanded to include First Aid, CPR, and emergency readiness that strengthen employability, education pathways, and community impact. Youth gain PPE and practical experience across placements such as appliance repair, retail, metal salvage, truck assistance, electrical testing, recycling and repair, construction and renovation, and marketing, building strong resumes while supporting Habitat's mission. The Emergency Response Program adds meaningful community service opportunities and real-world skill application. Youth earn certifications, strengthen confidence, and improve pathways to work and post-secondary education. Partnerships with St. Clair College continue to grow, expanding training opportunities and deepening community impact across Windsor-Essex.

Through tailored ADHD and disability coaching, participants build executive functioning skills such as planning, prioritizing, and completing tasks while gaining confidence, resilience, and leadership. In the short term, this support increases understanding of ADHD and other disabilities, strengthens readiness for school and employment, and reduces stress through practical strategies. In the long term, it supports sustained employment and educational success, greater independence, improved relationships, and reduced reliance on social services. As participants grow in confidence and independence, they contribute their talents and productivity to the community.

MADD CANADA (MOTHERS AGAINST DRUNK DRIVING)



MADD Canada's School Program educates youth on the risks and consequences of alcohol, drugs, and impaired driving, with a focus on building safer decision-making skills. In 2025 to 2026, it will reach more than 145,000 students in up to 1,000 schools across Canada, including 250 presentations in Ontario reaching up to 37,500 youth and five in Windsor-Essex reaching up to 725 local students. Each 60-minute presentation combines a powerful video with fictional and real-life victim and survivor stories, along with practical guidance on avoiding impaired driving. The program is highly effective, with 92% of students reporting it encourages responsible choices and 82% saying they are likely to plan safe transportation when going out with friends. Three months after participation, 91% of students recognize cannabis impairs driving.

MATTHEW HOUSE REFUGEE WELCOME CENTRE - WINDSOR



Empowering Refugees for Success is a collaborative initiative that helps refugee claimants overcome poverty, trauma, and food insecurity through coordinated supports in housing, counselling, employment training, and basic needs. The program provides immediate, wraparound assistance to stabilize individuals and families, including trauma-informed mental health care, relocation and housing support, access to food through community partners, and employment training, with a focus on supporting women. In the short term, it addresses urgent needs so participants can regain stability and security. In the long term, it promotes self-sufficiency through stable housing, economic independence, improved well-being, and successful integration into the Windsor-Essex community. By supporting refugees, the program strengthens individuals and the wider community.

MUSCULAR DYSTROPHY CANADA



Muscular Dystrophy Canada's Equipment Program is a critical source of support for individuals living with neuromuscular disorders, providing essential funding for specialized equipment that improves mobility, independence, and quality of life. As needs progress over time, access to adaptive equipment helps individuals remain engaged in school, work, and their communities while reducing isolation and barriers to participation. Because many costs are not fully covered by insurance or government programs, the organization acts as a funder of last resort, ensuring that those with the greatest need can access vital supports. Beyond physical benefits, this equipment reduces psychosocial challenges such as depression and stigma, while easing strain on families, caregivers, and the healthcare system.

SEXUAL ASSAULT CRISIS CENTRE OF ESSEX COUNTY (SACC)



Artificial intelligence is rapidly changing the online environment for youth and introducing new risks: deepfakes, voice cloning scams, financial sextortion, AI driven misinformation, and manipulative kid targeted content. In Windsor Essex, young people are increasingly exposed to content that can be difficult to verify, creating emotional, financial, and reputational risks. This project will equip youth and caregivers with practical, easy to use digital safety resources to help them recognize and respond to these threats. It will deliver short videos, educational carousels, printable guides, lesson activities, and caregiver toolkits that can be used in homes and schools without live facilitation. The goal is to strengthen digital literacy and build a safer, more resilient community.

SOUTH ESSEX COMMUNITY COUNCIL

This pilot project will hire a dedicated staff member to improve snack preparation, coordination, and food security planning across SECC's after-school youth programs. In the short term, it will ensure children and youth consistently receive nutritious, safely prepared snacks while easing pressure on frontline staff through a more efficient, centralized system. In the long term, the role will strengthen SECC's capacity to address food insecurity by building partnerships with local organizations and producers, improving internal processes, and collecting data to inform future planning. The staff member will also develop recommendations for a sustainable food security strategy, positioning SECC to leverage future funding opportunities and better support vulnerable children and youth in Windsor-Essex.

ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST ANGLICAN CHURCH

For the past 15 years, our weekly meal program has provided a free, home-cooked meal every Wednesday to individuals and families experiencing food insecurity, along with access to a small clothing and food pantry. Each week we prepare approximately 250 meals, currently offered through in-person dining, takeout, and delivery available, adapting our services due to reduced volunteer capacity. Our recipients are diverse and include seniors, individuals with mobility challenges, single-parent families, and members of the homeless community, including meals supplied to the local Homelessness Hub. This program ensures that those facing hardship receive at least one nutritious meal per week, helping to ease immediate food insecurity while supporting longer-term stability by allowing households to stretch limited resources further.

STARLIGHT CHILDREN'S FOUNDATION CANADA



The Starlight Handheld is a portable gaming device that supports the mental health of hospitalized children by using therapeutic play to reduce stress, encourage comfort, and improve the overall hospital experience. Children in hospital settings often face traumatic stress from separation, unfamiliar environments, and painful procedures, which can increase the risk of long-term health challenges. Evidence shows that play, distraction, and emotional support are important parts of care and can help children cope and communicate during treatment. By bringing entertainment and therapeutic gaming into care, this program helps turn moments of fear into comfort and joy while supporting better short and long term wellbeing for pediatric patients at Windsor Regional Hospital.

TETRA SOCIETY OF NORTH AMERICA



The Tetra Windsor chapter, led by David Harshaw, connects locally skilled volunteers with Windsor residents of any age living with a disability to design and build custom assistive devices that are not commercially available. These one of a kind solutions support greater independence in daily living, school, work, recreation, sports, music, and hobbies. Clients may experience improved health and reduced reliance on support services through devices such as wheelchair mounted systems that make daily tasks easier, including staying hydrated. Increased independence can also enable participation in education, employment, or volunteering, while reducing public system costs and benefiting the wider community.

The Short Term Financial Assistance program provides one time support to kidney patients facing urgent, health related expenses they cannot afford due to the financial impact of their illness. By easing immediate financial pressures, the program helps patients maintain access to essential care, medications, nutrition, and transportation so they can better manage their health and stay active and engaged in their communities. This support not only improves individual well being but also strengthens the broader community by reducing strain on healthcare services and fostering a more compassionate and supportive environment for people living with chronic illness.

THE TOWN OF TECUMSEH

Tecumseh Votes is a targeted initiative to increase voter turnout in the 2026 Municipal Election after participation fell to 28.72 percent in 2022. By hiring a Voter Engagement Specialist, the Town will lead a coordinated outreach campaign to educate residents about how to vote, who the candidates are, and why municipal government matters, with a goal of increasing turnout by 15 percent. The initiative will host candidate debates, create accessible educational materials, engage youth and new voters including those who speak languages other than English, strengthen communication through social and local media, and expand voting access through additional locations and advance polling options. Together, these efforts will reduce barriers, improve civic knowledge, and build a lasting culture of community participation.

Our Food Program provides a vital food bank for community residents without a secure source of food and serves a hot community lunch seven days a week for people experiencing hunger and homelessness in Windsor and Essex County. Individuals and families living on low incomes gain access to healthy, nutritious food and essential hygiene products, allowing them to direct their limited resources toward rent, utilities, and other financial commitments while reducing reliance on family or government support. For those living rough, we offer a welcoming place to enjoy a nutritious meal every day of the week and connect with supportive Mission programs. Through this program, we help build a healthier community where people can live with confidence, stability, and greater self sufficiency.

Trans Wellness Ontario's case management program provides free, gender affirming service navigation to support 2SLGBTQIA+ individuals and families facing barriers within healthcare and social service systems. Although we do not directly provide medical, legal, housing, or employment services, many community members rely on us for help accessing affirming providers, completing applications, attending appointments, and advocating for respectful care. By offering personalized guidance and referrals in a supportive, judgement free environment, the program reduces gaps in services and builds long term independence, empowerment, and confidence in navigating essential systems.

WINDSOR INTERNAL FILM FESTIVAL



WIFF Under the Stars (WUTS) is a free, inclusive outdoor film festival that brings arts and culture to downtown Windsor each summer, fostering community connection, supporting local businesses, and providing accessible entertainment for diverse audiences. As the only source of film programming in the downtown core, the festival fills a critical cultural gap while contributing to downtown revitalization efforts. In 2025, WUTS screened 23 feature films and welcomed 2,049 attendees, a 36 percent increase over the previous year, generating increased foot traffic and economic activity for surrounding businesses. Through this annual initiative, WIFF strengthens its leadership in Windsor-Essex, builds community through inclusive cultural experiences, and contributes to the long-term economic and social vitality of the downtown.

Collective Memory is a community art exhibition marking International Holocaust Remembrance Day by honouring all communities affected by the Nazi regime, including Jewish people, Black people, the Roma and Sinti, 2SLGBTQIA+ individuals, political prisoners, and people with disabilities. Through accessible creative contributions from Windsor-Essex and beyond, the project expands public understanding of the Holocaust, fosters inclusion, and encourages reflection and dialogue. It builds awareness, strengthens community engagement, supports creative expression and healing, and increases visibility for local artists and the broader arts community. Preserving stories through lasting archives, strengthens cross-community relationships, deepens historical understanding, and helps lay the foundation for ongoing remembrance and educational initiatives.

Through performance opportunities, mentorship - tuition scholarships that remove financial barriers, students build discipline, leadership, and a strong sense of belonging. The program strengthens the Windsor Essex community - fostering the next generation of engaged leaders and contributing to the vitality of downtown Windsor through its rehearsals and performances.
